COURSE DESCRIPTION:

THIS COURSE IS AN INTRODUCTION TO LIGHTING DESIGN. IT IS A COMBINATION OF LECTURE AND HANDS-ON LEARNING WITH CONCEPTS REINFORCED BY EXAMPLES. OUR LEARNING GOALS WILL BE:

- 1) TO LEARN AND USE VOCABULARY OF DESIGN AND THE LIGHTING INDUSTRY.
- 2) APPLY THE FOUNDATIONAL CONCEPTS TO DESCRIBE HOW DESIGN TOOLS FUNCTION.
- 3) ANALYZE DESIGN AND SCRIPT STRUCTURE.
- 4) PREPARE LIGHTING DESIGN DOCUMENTS.
- 5) CREATE AN ORIGINAL LIGHTING DESIGN FOR THE PROJECT, COMPLETE WITH ALL DOCUMENTATION AND PRESENTATION.

- 3). PROJECT (15%) CONSISTS OF A WRITTEN STATEMENT, PAPERWORK AND A PLOT FOR A DESIGN.
- 4). CLASS PARTICIPATION (5%) CLASS PARTICIPATION IS EXPECTED OF ALL STUDENTS. THE MAJORITY OF THIS CLASS WILL BE AN INFORMAL LECTURE FORMAT. I WILL PROVIDE YOU WITH BASIC COURSE INFORMATION, HOWEVER, QUESTIONS PROVIDE ADDITIONAL DEPTH FOR CLASS INFORMATION. THE MORE YOU INVEST IN THE CLASS, THE MORE VALUABLE IT WILL BE.
- 5). ATTENDANCE: LECTURES FORM THE MAIN SOURCE OF INFORMATION IN THIS CLASS, CONSEQUENTLY, IT IS IMPORTANT FOR YOU TO COME TO EVERY CLASS. ATTENDANCE WILL BE TAKEN. YOU ARE ALLOWED TO MISS 4 CLASS PERIODS DURING THE SEMESTER FOR ANY REASON, WITH OUT PENALTY. EACH CLASS MISSED BEYOND 4 ABSENCES IS CONSIDERED TO BE UN-EXCUSED. SIGNED MEDICAL EXCUSES ALLOW YOU TO MAKE UP WORK MISSED, AND DO NOT ERASE ABSENCES.
